Transfer students who have taken course work at an accredited college or university and attained a GPA of 2.0 or higher may be granted regular admission. Transferable courses completed with a grade of "C-" or better or the equivalent may be accepted. A minimum of 60 credit hours must be taken at an accredited four-year degree granting institution. Course work may also apply to the Bachelor of Science with an Option in Community Development.
