<small><sup>1</sup>Competency courses require a grade of "C" or higher to satisfy the requirement; this also includes Mathematics and Oral English. <sup>2</sup>Denotes preferred course selection. <sup>3</sup>If BCA 140 is taken then take no more than one (*) course to comply with CMU transfer and other institutional policies. <sup>4</sup>It is recommended that no more than two courses be taken in order to comply with CMU transfer and other institutional policies. <sup>5</sup>The course is also applicable to the Service Sector concentration.</small>	

### General notes:

- The difference between a Bachelor of Science degree and a Bachelor of Applied Arts degree is that the later requires a minor.
- A grade of "C-" or better is required for a course to transfer.
- Typically, a maximum of 64 semester hours of credit is accepted in transfer from a community college.
- The University Program requirements and competencies may be fulfilled by students who satisfy the MACRAO Agreement.

The remaining required and elective courses for the bachelor's degree will be selected in consultation with an academic advisor to ensure that CMU degree requirements are being met. The bachelor's degree requires a minimum of 124 semester hours of credit. A minimum of 60 credits must be from a four-year institution. A minimum of 30 semester hours of credit must be earned from CMU.
